Spring Learning Journey

Year 7- Kingdom of God/ Lent- Year 7 are studying the parables of Jesus

Year 8- Inspirational People- Students are studying a module on inspirational religious people and how their faith has inspired them.

Year 9- The Holocaust- Year 9 are studying the rise of antisemitism and the importance of standing up against evil

Year 10- Good & Evil- Year 10 are looking at religious beliefs around evil, suffering, the Incarnation and Jesus as a moral authority

Year 11- Sin & Forgiveness- Year 11 are studying capital punishment, forgiveness and redemption.

KS3 classes have knowledge organisers with keywords and activities that they must complete every fortnight.

Year 10 have revision guides and work is set from them each week to be completed at home independently.
